CARIBOO HISTORY TOUR

The \$110.00 per person charge for this course covers the cost of the bus rental, fuel, drivers' wages, and insurance. A lunch will be arranged each day somewhere along the way (cost about \$12.00). You can choose to order lunch or bring your own bag lunch. Washrooms may be few and far between. Dress appropriately for the weather, bring a camera, and come prepared to learn about some of our interesting Cariboo history.

Course Description: This tour will explore some of the history associated with the Cariboo Wagon Road as well as some of the local Williams Lake lore. It involves 3 full days of bus travel. On DAY 1, we will travel down to 100 Mile House, and work our way back to Williams Lake, checking out some of the old roadhouses and cemeteries along the route. On DAY 2, we explore the Mission area, the "old" Williams Lake and out to the Fraser River. On DAY 3, we go north to Quesnel, once again looking at the history of the roadhouses and ending with a visit to the Quesnel Museum.

Course Description: This course will provide you with a general understanding of cannabis growing and management including the use of various consumer products for growing, fertilizer use and product extraction. Don will touch on history of cannabis, best practices, security and legislation for the home grower. This is a discussion/practical course and will be directed by the level of questioning in a particular topic. Materials will be geared to the novice gardener level. Don looks forward to passing on his knowledge of cannabis management to Elder College members.

Course Leader: Don MacVicar is a keen, selfaccomplished Horticulturist with over 30 years of experience in the field of gardening and cannabis cultivation. He understands the processes of planting, cultivation, seed procurement along with harvest techniques. With practical smarts he is well versed and educated in recent updates to growing, legislation and product extraction processes (tinctures). Always up to date, he will demonstrate hardware for participants to use and try out. Don is presently employed by Good Guys Gardening Center in Williams Lake.

Course Description: This Android Course is tailored to focus on the areas which the class members want to explore. There will be six sessions, the content of which will depend upon the interest and requests of the participants. To start with, however, the first class will be a "Getting Started" session, where you will learn a little about your device – how it works, vocabulary, swiping, tapping, security, in general getting to know your Android and what it can do. A survey will be taken as well to see what areas class members want to learn about. Depending upon this survey, you may look at emails, social media, accessing and searching the web,

Each participant will be expected to bring along a small item to work on, and to provide his/her own tools (a list of supplies that you will need to bring will be available on registration day). The instructor will demonstrate the technique involved in laying and measuring fabric, cutting to size, and recovering the piece of furniture. This course is not designed for those who wish to take on a large reupholstery project.

BEETLE BASHING: THE LIFE CYCLE & MANAGEMENT OF THE DOUGLAS FIR BEETLE IN THE CARIBOO

Course Description: This community service course involves a review of the life cycle of the Douglas fir beetle in BC, and particularly in the Cariboo-Chilcotin area. We will look at the basic life cycle and how the beetle is managed in our forests. On a smaller scale, we will examine how to control the beetle around your property and how to prevent the attack and spread of this pest into your trees. Along the way, we will discuss ticks in the Cariboo, the diseases they carry, and how to protect yourself from them. This course will involve approximately 2 hours in a classroom situation and a short 2-3 hour filed session in the forest.

Course Leader: Leo Rankin has a Masters degree in Pest Management from Simon Fraser University. Now retired, he worked in the forest industry for more than 40 years, including being the Forest Entomologist in the Cariboo Forest region during his 25 years tenure with the BC Ministry of Forests. Most of his work over the years involved management of bark beetles and defoliators of commercial forests as well as forest plantation pests.

The End-of-Life training, including a module on Advance Care Planning is being provided to TRU Nursing programs, First Nations Communities and Better At Home. Her personal Advance Care Planning education includes numerous workshops and on-line training. These tools are used to guide Family meetings to 'start conversations' with individuals and their families.

Registration:

<u>Members should register for themselves whenever possible</u>. Should a member have to be away on registration day the member can ask another member to register their class or classes for them. **Only one proxy per member will be allowed. Mail course registrations will not be accepted**.

<u>**Course Fees**</u> are usually \$35, all computer courses (regardless of the number of sessions are \$40.00). Exceptions to this fee structure may apply. Fees have been established by the Executive Board, in consultation with the Finance and Curriculum Committees.

<u>Cancellation Fees</u> of 10% of the course fee shall be levied to cover administrative costs if notice to cancel is given at least seven (7) days prior to the beginning of the course.

<u>Refund</u> - If notice of cancellation is less than seven (7) days, course fees will not be refunded
