Participants will create their own advance care plan during these three classes and have the tools to assist others with this planning.

She is happy to provide this training for Elder College once again. She has attended numerous workshops and on-line training to hone her skills. Course Description: The foods that people eat, the ways these foods are prepared, and food growing processes all can tell us a great deal about ancient cultures. Our local TRU Archaeology Instructor, Beth Bedard, will describe the impact foods have on social groups, how foods assist in archaeological studies and what foods can tell us. This will be an interesting look into current archaeological practices and techniques. This course is a follow-up to the previous series.

Course Leader: Beth Bedard, BA, MA, PHD has for more than 30 years, as an anthropologist studied various and diverse archaeological sites in several parts of the world, especially here in BC. Currently she instructs classes in Anthropology at TRU in Williams Lake, Beth's many years of experience in the field and her deep interest in BC First Nations history and culture provide her with unique and solid insights into her chosen field of study.

BREEDING BIRDS OF THE WILLIAMS LAKE RIVER VALLEY

Course Leader: Phil Ranson Course Coordinator: Chris Coates Time: Sunday, June 4 @ 8:00 am – 11:00 am Place: meet at parking lot below Mackenzie Ave across from cemetery at the foot of Cameron Street Course Fee: \$15.

Class Size: up to 12

Course Description: By early June nearly all our breeding birds are back on territory, including neo tropical migrants which have travelled several thousand kilometers to spend a few short months to rest and raise their young before undertaking the journey south. One of the best places to see and listen to the greatest variety of these birds is the Williams Lake River Valley. A variety of habitats in a condensed and accessible area make this one of most prized locations in the region. We expect to find up to 7 species of Warbler, 4 or 5 types of Flycatchers, 3 species of Vireos, as well as Oriole, Thrushes, and an assortment of other birds. With luck, some of these birds will be encountered on their nests. Due to their secretive nature, we may have to rely on song or calls alone to identify these species. We will meet on Sunday, June 4 at 8 am at the parking lot on Mackenzie Avenue across from the cemetery. From there we may possibly carpool to the parking lot in the lower valley. Binoculars and a bird identification book are highly recommended. Dress according to the weather, and bring bug spray! We expect to be on established trails for most of the three hours session. with a travel distance on foot of about two kilometers.

Course Leader: **Phil Ranson** was a regional coordinator for the BC Breeding Bird Atlas, a survey that ran from 2008 – 2012; he was also the compiler for the Williams Lake Christmas Bird Count, and has been operating a local on-line birding discussion group since 1998. His interest in birds goes back to his childhood in England, when during summer holidays, along with his brothers, time was spent working on their birds eggs collection. Now, decades later egg collecting is frowned upon, but Phil's interest in birds has remained strong and he has become a recognized expert on our local bird species.

Course Description: This course will teach participants to strip, clean, stain or paint a piece of furniture. The item you bring must be taken home with you after each session, so choose a small, portable piece. You will be taught basic repairs and become familiar with the finishing options available. You will be introduced to Fusion Mineral paints, as well as a variety of wood stains and the clear finishes both of those products require.

Tony Savile is a local craftsman who has been in the furniture refinishing, repair and antique restoration business for more than 25 years from his workshop.

Shalene Ostrom has always enjoyed painting but it was during the Covid lockdown in 2020 that she

Course Description: Working with fused glass is a beautiful 4000 year old craft from ancient Egypt. In the past 75 years or so, it has enjoyed a resurgence in popularity. In this class, you will select a piece of glass and learn how to handcraft it into a pendant or a light catcher (or one of each). Each piece will then be kiln fired, and you will have a lovely piece of jewelry and/or decorative item. The class takes about two hours, and all materials and tools are provided for you to create your own masterpiece.

Course Leaders: John Bos and Norma Bos – John Bos has been involved in glassmaking for almost 50 years. After he retired in 1991, he and his wife Norma, began Bos Glassworks which focused on stained glass, Plexiglas, and glass repairs. Over the years in Williams Lake, John and Norma have been very involved in the community.
